The same table contains separate columns for other markets, so readers can identify each result without mixing the different record series.

Satta King Old Record

Old records are important for anyone who wants to look back at previous results instead of checking only the latest chart. A useful archive lets readers move from recent results to older months and years. SattaKingRecords.com provides yearly record-chart links for 2025, 2024, 2023, 2022, 2021, 2020, 2019, 2018, 2017, 2016 and 2015. This gives the website a broad historical record structure for visitors searching for older Satta King results.

Monthly archive links are also available from the current chart page. This type of organization is helpful when a reader remembers approximately when a result appeared but does not know the exact day. Instead of scrolling through one very long page, the user can move through the relevant month or year and find the record more efficiently.

Gali Satta Record

Gali is one of the market names shown in the current record archive. The website has a dedicated Gali 2026 record section as well as Gali entries inside the broader current chart. The September 2026 table, for example, lists Gali results for September 1 through September 13, including 81, 96, 77, 26, 37, 94, 10, 64, 69, 40, 34, 35 and 72 respectively. A dedicated market section makes these entries easier to locate.

Disawar Satta King Record

Disawar is another prominently listed market in the record chart. The September 2026 table shows daily Disawar entries alongside several other markets. Keeping Disawar in its own column is useful because a multi-market chart can otherwise become difficult to read when many two-digit results appear close together.

How to Read a Satta King Chart

Check the date

Start with the exact date you want to verify. A two-digit result without its date has very little context.

Check the market

Read the column heading carefully. Disawar, Gali, Old Taj, Delhi Bazaar and other markets are separate record series.

Check the archive

For older results, use the relevant monthly or yearly record section instead of assuming the latest page contains every historical entry.

Compare carefully

If you compare two results, make sure they belong to the same market and the same date format.

Why People Use Satta King Records

A dedicated Satta King record page is primarily useful because it saves time. Instead of searching through multiple posts, users can open a chart and find the date and market they need. It is also easier to review historical information when results are arranged in rows and columns. For regular visitors, a yearly archive provides a quick way to move between current records and previous years.
